
## Abajian Exhibits in Japan

La Crescenta artist Srboohie Abajian has been invited by the Armenian Embassy in Japan to exhibit her work at "Armenia Culture Week" in Tokyo. The exhibition features her series "All Roads Lead To People" and will premiere a video presentation of her "Murals on the Sky" public art project.

Srboohie's "All Roads Lead To People" explores the essence of the human need for companionship and how this plays out in the immigrant population in Los Angeles. This series highlights faces, eyes, and hands that are searching for connections to other people – demanding humanity and love against the legacy of genocide and isolation.

In addition to Abajian's work, Armenian Diaspora artists Jean Jansem (France) and Dana Walrath (New York) are represented in the exhibition.

Armenia Culture Week is organized by Ambassador Grant Pogosyan and Attaché Yervand Markosyan in



celebration of 25 years of cooperation between Japan and Armenia. This event showcases arts and culture by artists and performers from Japan, Armenia and the Armenian Diaspora. Events were held May 9-14 at the Daikanyama Hillside Terrace in Tokyo, Japan.
